Results show that the typical school had adopted curriculum standards or guidelines proposed by state departments of education, rather than by a national body. Despite the general interest in standards, the choices made by parents, teachers, and students reflected many values, of which the desire for independence was one of the strongest. Students who were surveyed exhibited high optimism, especially those students from middle- class families. (RJM)

What lies behind their success? Are they good—or just lucky? What patterns have they unraveled? And are their forecasts really
