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While rural areas offer many benefits, supporting aging in place may require more careful planning and coordination than in other settings. Nearly 90% of older adults would like to remain in their

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Research documents that rural elders are poorer, live in less adequate housing, and have far fewer health and service options available to them than their urban counterparts, yet there is a critical lack of current and detailed information on the problems facing rural elders and on the professional practices that serve this population.

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Rural communities are ageing faster than other parts of the UK with approximately half of the rural population aged over 45, compared with 36 per cent in major urban areas.

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
