Annuals complete that cycle in one growing season, whereas perennials live on for three years or longer. But, if you begin studying the labels on your new plant or seed packet purchases, you'll discover many twists on this basic definition. You'll come across terms such as "hardy" and "half-hardy" annual, or tender perennial.

A drought- and heat-tolerant perennial wildflower, blanket flower (Gaillardia) provides long-lasting color, even in spots with poor soil.In red, gold, or brown, its daisy-like, 3-inch wide, single or double perennial flowers bloom through the summer and into the fall. Although often short-lived, it's easy to grow and will flower the first year from seed.

Annuals: Plants that flower and die in one season are annuals—although some drop seeds that grow new plants in the spring. Annuals typically bloom all season until frost, so you get consistent color and showy blooms. These plants can go in the ground any time, even in midsummer, to refresh your beds. Perennials: Perennials, on the other hand, come back for many seasons.

Whether you plant from seed or purchase seedlings to plant, an annual will sprout, flower, seed and then die — all in the same year. Annuals tend to bloom all season long and are often bright and showy. Though you will have to replant next year (or choose another plant to put in your annual's place), annual plants tend to cost less than perennials and are less of a commitment.

Annual flowers, or annuals, have a lifespan of one year, rather than occurring yearly as the name might suggest. On the other hand, perennial flowers, or perennials, grow back every spring. Both of these words stem from the Latin root for "year."

Annual plants are thus those that last for a portion of but a single year (even in their native climates). Perennial plants have something extra: that "per" in their name. The per-prefix in Latin adds to what comes after it. So perennials, given the proper conditions, will live extra years, when compared to annual plants.

All roots, stems and leaves of the plant die annually. Only the dormant seed bridges the gap between one generation and the next. Perennials - Plants that persist for many growing seasons.
