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The aim of this article is to review the major risk factors for autoimmune disease, both hereditary and environmental, and so to help define those future criteria. Individuals who are at risk to develop an autoimmune disease should be advised to refrain from activities and lifestyle which endangers their health and quality of life.

Autoimmune diseases and severe infections as risk factors

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Our initial research on prediction of autoimmune disease used both spontaneous and experimentally induced forms of thyroiditis in chickens and mice. The primary early risk factors for induction of an autoimmune response were identified among the genes of the major histocompatibility complex (MHC). Heightened susceptibility depended on potent activation of self-antigen-specific T lymphocytes by antigen-presenting cells bearing the same MHC.
