The works of Mary Wollstonecraft (1759-1797) ranged from the

early *Thoughts on the Education of Daughters to The Female Reader*, a selection of texts for girls, and included two novels. But her reputation is founded on *A Vindication of the Rights of Woman* of 1792. This treatise is the first great document of feminism—and is now accepted as a core text in western tradition. It is not widely known that the germ of Wollstonecraft’s great work came out of an earlier and much shorter vindication—*A Vindication of the Rights of Men* (1790), written in the context of the issues raised by the French Revolution.
