#### Documenting User Stories

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Bundle user stories into groups. User stories need to be grouped to form a clearer structure. There are many ways to group user stories, for example, based on the work process. An item can maybe pass different stages such as draft, under review or published. You can also group by how the items are handles, e.g. create, modify and delete.

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Documentation based on user stories. Action-oriented docs can be based on user stories, which helps documentation writers make sure they write about things users

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The common User Stories template includes the user, the action and the value (or the benefit) and typically looks like this: As a [type of user], I want [an action] so that [a reason/a value] User Stories can help you to constantly improve the value of your product, estimate development efforts in an appropriate way and prioritize feature development during the MVP and post-MVP stages.

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User stories emerged in Extreme Programming (XP), and the early XP literature talks about story cards rather than user stories. There is a simple reason: User stories were captured on paper cards. This approach provides three benefits: First, paper cards are cheap and easy to use.

### How to write good user stories - Every Interaction

User stories are a few sentences in simple language that outline the desired outcome. They don't go into detail. Requirements are added later, once agreed upon by the team. Stories fit neatly into agile frameworks like scrum and kanban. In scrum, user stories are added to sprints and "burned down" over the duration of the sprint.

User stories are short descriptions of functionality told from the user's perspective. The focus is on why and how the user interacts with the software. A user story is essentially a high-level definition of what the software should be capable of doing.

User stories, introduced by Agile, tackle this issue by making the user the center of the requirement, and Behavior Driven Development (BDD) takes things a step further providing a framework where the user behavior is what drives the development. Using BDD techniques to create user stories makes documenting requirements easier to write and read.

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Documenting User Stories User stories are often written on index cards or sticky notes, stored in a shoe box, and arranged on walls or tables to facilitate planning and discussion. As such, they strongly shift the focus from writing about features to discussing them.

Valuable - the user stories should add value to the final product. Estimatable - the team must be able to use the user stories to estimate/approximate work. Small - large or vague user stories are difficult to estimate. User stories should be able to be designed, built, and tested within a single iteration.
