Food safety is not just a technical problem, it also has a major behavioural component, as the culture of an organisation reflects what employees really think, how they feel, and ultimately how they act. It is therefore an essential component of effective food safety management.

Food safety culture's aim is to increase awareness and improve the behavior of employees in establishments.

A food safety culture is the values of a business with regard to food safety. An organisation with a strong food safety culture demonstrates to its employees and customers that making safe food is an important commitment. Why is a positive food safety culture important?

Within the food industry, food safety culture can be described as the "prevailing attitudes, values and practices related to food safety that are taught, directly and indirectly, to new employees" (Taylor, 2011).

A good food safety culture can protect: consumers from foodborne illness your brand's reputation your business from financial loss.

The GFSI TWG defines food safety cultures as, "shared values, beliefs and norms that affect mind- set and behaviour toward food safety in, across and throughout an organization." The definition is derived from existing literature on organizational and food safety culture and made practical and applicable through the group's work.

Achieving food safety is a multi-sectoral effort requiring expertise from a range of different disciplines – toxicology, microbiology, parasitology, nutrition, health economics, and human and veterinary medicine.

In the context of a food safety culture, the C-suite must make decisions and exhibit practices that clearly demonstrate a commitment to the quality and safety of the product. When executives make decisions that value the safety and quality of shipped product over revenues, this is the culture that will boost employee morale and commitment, protect the public interest, and the company's bottom line.

What do we actually mean by 'food safety culture'? Well, there are some rather wordy academic definitions or more simply, you may have heard the following used to describe culture:
