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Basics of Pitman Shorthand

Invented by Sir Isaac Pitman, an English educator, the Pitman shorthand method was first published in 1837 as Stenographic Sound Hand. Pitman's system Pitman shorthand, system of rapid writing based on the sounds of words (i.e., the phonetic principle) rather than on conventional spellings.

Pitman shorthand is a system of shorthand for the English language developed

by Englishman Sir Isaac Pitman (1813-1897), who first presented it in 1837. Like most systems of shorthand, it is a phonetic system; the symbols do not represent letters, but rather sounds, and words are, for the most part, written as they are spoken.

As one might imagine, pitman shorthand was named for the person who first came up with it. An individual by the name of Sir Isaac Pitman developed the symbols and techniques used for this type of shorthand sometime in the mid-1800s.

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What is shorthand? There are many systems prevailing in the world. However Pitman system is considered the simplest and pioneer of all systems.

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The spacing for Pitman style shorthand, which is one of the most widely used and

oldest versions of shorthand, is 3/8 of an inch thick. Learn to read and write the most basic letters of shorthand. You should first learn the appropriate shorthand symbols for the sounds "th," such as in the words "thin," "thank" and "think."

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In Pitman, you write the consonant sounds first to form a shorthand "outline" and then, if necessary, mark in the vowels. In many instances, no vowel marks are necessary. Vowels should, however, be marked in full the first time a proper name is mentioned (or if the name has an unfamiliar spelling, it should be spelled out in regular letters).
