Mark 10:29-30 Jesus' statement above is in response to Peter who said to Him, "We have given up everything and followed you." It was as if Peter were patting himself on the back, attempting to highlight just how much he and the other disciples had sacrificed to follow Jesus. And it was true, they did give up everything of their former life. They left home, their occupation, their relationships and everything that had been part of their daily established life in response to the call of Jesus. They were truly all in. In hearing this statement from Peter, Jesus does not give the expected response. He doesn't say to Peter, "Yes, you have, that's very impressive Peter. Good job and thank you!" Instead, Jesus immediately explains to Peter that the sacrifice he and the others have made is worth it.
