Guided reading is a great tool for students K-12. Just adjust your readings and questions according to what level you are teaching. To teach guided reading, you'll need to determine your students' instructional reading level (IRL). The easiest way to do that is to use a chart provided by your school to identify what level each student reads at.

She sees 2 of these groups every day; two of these groups every other day; and the final group 1-2 times per week.

*Guided Reading in a First Grade Classroom - Zoom Zoom ...*

Guided reading has always been one of my favorite parts of the day. It's a time for me to work with small groups of students to help them become stronger, more confident readers. I meet with at least 2 groups a day for 15-20 minutes (groups are flexible and based on skill/reading level). My struggling readers work with me each day.

Narrator: In this Classroom Close-Up segment, we zoom in on fifth grade teacher, Jenna Ogier, as she teaches two Guided Reading groups. The first group is learning to identify the main problem of a chapter, and how to defend assertions with evidence directly from the text. Jenna: "So, your assignment was to read Chapter 2, Mark Miller, OK?

Guided Reading Question Cards. During guided reading, I may be reading with one student while the other members of the group are reading independently at the table. Here's where guided reading question cards come in handy. Students can think about or even use them to complete a written response so they are ready for discussion.

Optional Quick Write ~ Students write 5-6 Fluency Words on white boards (not necessary for grades 3 and up).Old Story ~ Students reread for 4 minutes a portion of yesterday's book or chapter for fluency and accuracy. Teacher takes a running record on 1 student. Mini-Lesson ~ The mini-lesson is based on teacher observations of students' needs from YESTERDAY'S book. Introduce the skill in ...

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For Allison Hepfer, who teaches kindergarten at Hamagrael Elementary in Delmar, New York, guided reading is a cornerstone of her literacy instruction. She meets with small groups of students on a daily basis, supporting them as they learn to use reading strategies. "Guiding reading is one of the best ways to differentiate," Hepfer says.

What the guided reading with non-readers lesson cycle should look like. When it comes to a guided reading lesson outline, I like what Jan Richardson suggests in her book *The Next Step in Guided Reading*. Unknowingly, this is roughly what I have followed since I first started teaching in 2008. She suggests the following 4 areas of focus.

Below is a visual representation of my favorite schedule to use with Kindergarten or first grade (I sometimes see 2nd graders just twice per day). In this example, there are 5 different groups. From lowest to highest, they are: Red, Orange, Yellow, Green, Blue.

Guided Reading Books. Deanna Jump and I were at it again and decided to put together a guided reading set of nonfiction texts to support the learning of science topics. These informational leveled readers are perfect for your guided reading groups.

The group that is working with me grabs their book box, sits at the horseshoe table, and picks a previous guided reading book from their book box to start reading while they wait for me. This gives me a chance to make sure that everyone else is at their correct station and there are no problems before I settle in for (hopefully) 20 minutes of uninterrupted guided reading time!

Guided reading is all about practice, so have students whisper read (or silently read - in late first grade and second grade) all of the words on their own. That said, some students in Kindergarten or early first grade may need more support than the book introduction in order to be successful with the text.

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
