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Take a couple of journals in your field that you will target now or soon. Scan all the abstracts over the past few issues. Analyse them: look closely at all first and last sentences. The first...

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Plan your essay and make a basic outline. Take notes from your sources and add details to your outline and make sure that you have supporting evidence for your points. Write the first draft of your essay. You can start from any part and you shouldn't worry about grammar, punctuation and spelling as you construct your sentences.

First or Second Person: In professional writing, the author is assumed to have "distance" from his or her subject. In general, you should write as an outside observer, not a participant, and you should treat the reader in the same way. Pronouns such as I or we may be suitable for reporting research results or case studies.

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Scholarly writing is at its best when it is elegant and graceful, but the only hard and fast criterion is that the writing be clear (correct), so that editors and referees can understand what point the writer is trying to make and can judge whether that point is worthy of putting into print.

To write a successful seminar paper, one should observe a few conventions: the paper has to be logically structured and easy for the reader to follow To make the logic of the paper's structure immediately obvious to the reader, the first or INTRODUCTORY PARAGRAPH should provide a "map" of the structure and content of the paper.

The Writing Process Outline. Write out your main argument in full.
