The Birth of Islamic Law During the time of the Prophet (sall Allāhu ‘alayhi wa sallam), while the revelation was descending from the heavens, the Prophet (sall Allāhu ‘alayhi wa sallam) was planting the Islamic foundations with the laws that were being revealed to him. On various occasions these rulings came as comprehensive principles;

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Conceptually, the human attempt to understand divine law (shariah). Whereas shariah is immutable and infallible, fiqh is fallible and changeable. Fiqh is distinguished from usul al-fiqh, the methods of legal interpretation and analysis.

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
