Lewis Carl Davidson Hamilton MBE (born 7 January 1985) is a British racing driver who races in Formula One for Mercedes AMG Petronas. Promising to reveal everything that his official autobiography did not, this is an objective picture of the Manchester United former captain, from his early days to his golden era, and his tumultuous relationship with United's Manager leading to being kicked out of the club.

Sir Lewis Carl Davidson Hamilton MBE HonFREng, born in Stevenage, Hertfordshire, England, UK on 7th January 1985, is a professional racing driver, who competes in Formula 1 for Mercedes, having previously driven for McLaren from 2007 - 2012. Lewis has

won a record 7 F1 World Drivers' Championship titles, tied with Michael Schumacher, along with the record most wins (99), pole positions (101) & podium finishes (175). Brought up in Stevenage, Hamilton joined the McLaren young driver programme during 1998, which led to a Formula 1 drive with McLaren in 2007, remaining the only black driver to race in the series. Lewis set many records that season as he finished runner-up to Kimi Räikkönen by a point. The following season, he won his 1st title after overtaking on the last lap of the final race of the season to become the youngest ever F1 World Champion. After 4 more years with McLaren, Hamilton signed with Mercedes during 2013. Changes to the regulations the following year, mandating the use of turbo-hybrid engines, led to the start of an extremely successful period for Lewis, during which he won 6 more drivers' titles. Consecutive wins came in 2014 then 2015, during an intense rivalry with his team-mate Nico Rosberg. After Rosberg's retirement, Ferrari's Sebastian Vettel became Hamilton's closest rival in a couple of intense championship battles, during which Lewis twice overturned mid-season point deficits to lift successive titles again in 2017 - 2018. His 3rd and 4th consecutive titles followed during 2019 & 2020, equalling Schumacher's record.

When he eventually hung up his helmet for good, he started his own airline and had to deal with the horrendous aftermath when one of his aircraft crashed, killing all 223 on board. He later returned to the sport in various management roles and successfully persuaded Lewis Hamilton to join Mercedes. Maurice Hamilton first came across Lauda in 1971 and in this definitive biography tells his remarkable story. Based on interviews with friends, family, rival drivers and colleagues, it is a superb tribute to a brave, supremely talented and much-missed star of Formula One.
