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The paper is divided into three sections: section 1 gives a general introduction to life skills-based hygiene education; section 2 gives a general overview of the content of life skills-based hygiene education; and section 3 provides a set of examples of lesson plans for life skills-bases hygiene education.

Life skills-based hygiene education offers teachers the opportunity to help children obtain life skills by addressing hygiene issues. The Community Based Life Skills (CBLS) Program is a program that is designed to assist youth in attaining the skills necessary in becoming independent responsible adults. CBLS utilizes the Learning Inventory of Skills Training (LIST) to assess the youth's knowledge and understanding of a variety of life skills and to focus attention on life skills that need improvement.
