### Hospice Myths and Facts :: United Hospice of Rockland Myth #1: Morphine makes hospice patients die faster

Doctors, too, can be afraid of using Morphine (and similar drugs), largely due to misinformation and lack of training. The reality is that Morphine (and other opiates that work in the same way, such as hydrocodone, oxycodone, hydromorphone, etc.) is effective and safe for the treatment of pain.

Myth #1: Morphine makes hospice patients die faster End of Life Journey Due to its use near and at the time of end-of-life, many individuals and their family worry that morphine may speed-up the dying process.

Myth: Hospice staff encourages the use of morphine for all hospice patients. Fact: Morphine is often used to control pain or shortness of breath. Not all patients experience these symptoms. Each person's symptoms are controlled in consultation with their physician in a way that works best for them. Myth: Dying is painful.

**The 4 Common Myths About Hospice Care**

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Myth: Morphine signifies that physicians have "given up" on a patient with a terminal illness. Fact: Morphine does not have this meaning today and is not used only for terminal care. There is evidence that patients whose pain is relieved do better than those whose rest and nutrition continues to be disturbed by continued pain.

An additional myth is that morphine will stop working after so long. In essence, sometimes patients believe the medication will not work at the later stages of hospice when a patient's pain may be increased. This is not true. Indeed sometimes patients pain medication requirement increases, but we can increase the dose of these medications.

Myth #4: Hospice Is Only for Patients Actively Dying or Close to Death In 2017, the median length of service for hospice patients was 24 days. This means that of the estimated 1.5 million patients who received hospice services that year, half received hospice care for less than 24 days, and the other half received it for longer than that.
