The Deuterocanonical books ( there are ten (or according to some eleven) books even though they are not part of the Hebrew canon, are considered . Authoritative by the Catholic Church and the Eastern Orthodox churches. These books are called Deuterocanonical books.

Although most of the poetry and hymns from the Apostolic father is no longer with

us, what has been preserved is given here in a beautiful form translated faithfully from the original Greek. The translator is a gifted poet that was awarded high honours for his work on this and other projects. Leaving the task to translate such vivid and real poetry from such a time as we have not seen before could only be handled by a true poet at heart. These hymns will bring you to a time and place where the gospel was being preached boldly and will embolden you to take on the evangelical call to spread the word of our saviour Jesus Christ.
