Activity Analysis Activity analysis is a fundamental skill of occupational therapists. A process used to identify the inherent properties is a given occupation, task, or activity as well as skills, abilities or capacities required to complete it. (Trombly, 5th ed.).

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Cooking was chosen as it was specific to the age of our clients and is an activity that plays an integral part in the way the family roles and routines are developed. Other Considerations - Perfor-

mance skills (cognitive, motor, etc) - Complexity

Occupational therapists need to plan and organize cooking activities in relation to the level of cognitive and physical ability of a person with memory loss for successful completion of tasks. Cooking tasks need to be tailored to the cognitive and physical abilities of the participants.

An activity analysis is a systematic evaluation of an activity to determine its suitability for a particular client or intervention. The activity analysis identifies the physical and temporal needs for the activity, the required client factor and performance skill needs for the activity, and the therapeutic benefit of the activity.
