For many families, including Markosian's, this soap opera symbolized the opportunities of America and the West; for her project, Markosian wrote a script in collaboration with one of the original *Santa Barbara* writers and hired actors to reenact moments from her personal history. A major exhibition of this work, including a three-channel film presentation, will open at *Rencontres d'Arles* in July 2020, in advance of a fall 2020 exhibition at the San Francisco Museum of Modern Art.
