Early literacy and child development - Let's Read

This is important for your child's early literacy development. Engage in: joint reading, drawing, singing, storytelling, reciting, game playing, and rhyming. When joint reading, you and your child take turns reading parts of a book. When reading, ask her to connect to the story.

Early Literacy - ZERO TO THREE

Early language and literacy (reading and writing) development begins in the first 3 years of life and is closely linked to a child's earliest experiences with books and stories. The interactions that young children have with such literacy materials as books, paper, and crayons, and with the adults in their lives are the building blocks for language, reading, and writing development.

Reading: its importance in literacy development. It's a good idea to read with your child often. It's best to start reading from birth, but it's never too late to begin. Reading with children from an early age helps them develop a solid foundation for literacy. It also promotes bonding and is good for your relationship with your child.

There are a number of foundation skills that will promote literacy development in the early years. As well as conversation, sound awareness is an important skill. This can help young children recognise that words are made up of different syllables and how certain letters correspond to sounds.

Educators can use a range of methods of documentation to capture the breadth and depth of literacy learning, including: transcripts of conversations. drawing and writing samples. reading transcripts. learning stories. anecdotes. photographs (of children's constructions, for example) videos (of dancing, for example).
