Getting Ready to Read: Anticipation Guide

An Anticipation Guide is a valuable pre-reading strategy that supports student comprehension by activating schema and sparking student interest in the topic. Anticipation guides work best when students are provided a series of provocative and unique statements. Additionally, anticipation guides are effective when students are given a chance to discuss their thinking throughout the Anticipation Guide.

Anticipation Guide. Definition/Description: An anticipation guide is used before reading to activate students' prior knowledge and get students excited and curious about a new topic. Before reading, students listen to the teacher or another student state key ideas about the concepts in the text. They can also read several statements about the key concepts presented in the text.

Sample of "Anticipation Guide" For Science Directions: • Read the following statements concerning acid rain. Decide whether you think each statement is true or false. • Put a check before the appropriate box on the left.

Identify the major ideas presented in the reading. Consider what beliefs your students are likely to have about the topic. Write general statements that challenge your students' beliefs. Require students to respond to the statements with either a positive or negative response.

Construction of the anticipation guide should be as simple as possible for younger students. Write four to six statements about key ideas in the text; some true and some false. Include columns following each statement, which can be left blank or can be labeled Yes, or No (Maybe can also be used). NOTE: Teachers may wish to create an additional column for revisiting the guide after the material has been read.

For example, below are statements you could use when creating an anticipation guide to prepare students to address the themes of justice and forgiveness: Punishing perpetrators for wrongdoing is necessary to achieve justice. Offenders should suffer for the crimes they have committed.

After carefully reviewing the instructions with the class (if this is the first time they've done an anticipation guide), read the statements to them, with them, or have them read individually.
