Avoid being subjective - do not add your opinions, personal experiences, thoughts or judgments when writing down observations. For example: Maya has been crying because she misses her mum and is scared she

won't come back...

In Piaget's Three-Mountain Task, for example, children in the concrete operational stage can describe how a mountain scene would look to an observer seated opposite them. In other words, kids are not only able to start thinking about how other people view and experience the world, they even start to use this type of information when making decisions or solving problems.

The sample size is typically denoted by n and it is always a positive integer. No exact sample size can be mentioned here and it can vary in different research settings. However, all else being equal, large sized sample leads to increased precision in estimates of various properties of the population.
