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Teshuvah is one of the great gifts God gives each of us – the ability to turn back to Him and seek healing for our brokenness. Psalm 51 is sometimes called "Perek Teshuvah" – the great Chapter of Repentance of the Scriptures.

Repentance (Hebrew : תשובה, literally, "return", pronounced "tshuva" or "teshuva") is one element of atoning for sin in Judaism. Judaism recognizes that everybody sins on occasion, but that people can stop or minimize those occasions in the future by repenting for past transgressions.

In the Jewish tradition, repentance is called teshuvah, a Hebrew word translated as "returning." One of the Hebrew words for sin is chet, which in Hebrew means "to go astray." Thus the idea of repentance in Jewish thought is a return to the path of righteousness.

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Resolve (kabbalah) There seems to be a part of us that is all too ready to avoid work, effort and discomfort. The key to teshuva, to lasting growth, is to eliminate the confusion of comfort with pleasure. Comfort is nothing more than the absence of pain; while pain and effort and discomfort are usually prerequisites for lasting pleasure.

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This first step of teshuva is indeed the most crucial — because unless a person feels regret, he will most likely continue in his errant ways. Step 2: Cessation. The Talmud says: A person who made a mistake and admits it, but does not renounce doing it again, is compared to going into the mikveh holding a dead reptile in his hand.
