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In reporting on politics, the media help se-

lect the issues that are to receive public attention and help shape the public agenda. The free flow of a meaningful account of political events and issues is necessary for the public's understanding of politics, the formation of PUBLIC OPINION and the public's participation in the political process.

The enormous amount of attention given by the news media to politics and political figures implies a public with a great interest in and a huge appetite for such information. Interest and appetite in fact de-

scribe only a modest proportion of the public. The resolution of political issues depends on debate and conflict.
