better performance and makes driving safer; appropriate gear changes become a way to reduce engine stress, prolong engine life, improve fuel economy, minimize wear on brake linings. Knowing how to change the engine oil or replace worn sparking plugs is not essential for a driver, but it will reduce costs. Learning such basics will not make one a fully fledged mechanic, even less an automotive engineer; but it all contributes to more economical and safer driving, alerting one to the dangers of bald tyres, leaking exhaust, worn brake linings.
