Physically, from the moment we are conceived till the moment we die, we are developing biologically. Our bodies are consistently moving from one biological change to another. Subsequently, the growth of our intellectual and social development comes.

Unless carers become proficient at 'mind-reading', or understanding children's behaviour, they may not be able to help them experience and express their feelings safely or teach them ways to manage their responses to other people and a range of events. Whilst practitioners are usually aware that children's behaviour is a form of communication it is still important to call this to mind in supervision, otherwise this important point can be overlooked.

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The five approaches to understanding human behaviour

An understanding of child development is essential because it allows us to fully appreciate the cognitive, emotional, physical, so-

cial, and educational growth that children go through from birth and into early adulthood.

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 Understanding child and adolescent behavior can help parents create rules, boundaries and disciplinary strategies that are appropriate for the child's age and stage of development. For instance, understanding that it is normal for children and young teens to be self-centered and focus on their own needs above those of others can ensure that you do not set behavioral expectations for your child that she cannot achieve.

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The assumptions made about behaviour come down to the fact  
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 It is generally agreed that cognitive development is a prerequisite for meaningful growth in other lines of development. Our social skills, values, morality, for example, are dependent on our thinking and our processing abilities, that is, our cognitive capacities.
