Punctuation is the system of signs or symbols given to a reader to show how a sentence is constructed and how it should be read. Sentences are the building blocks used to construct written accounts. They are complete statements. Punctuation shows how the sentence should be read and makes the meaning clear.

A run-on sentence is made of multiple independent clauses joined by only a comma or no punctuation at all. If one independent clause is an explanation or definition of the other, add a word like "because" or "which" to the beginning of the explanation (examples 1 and 2).

To make sure our written words convey our exact meanings, we need to understand the fundamentals of the English language, such as the parts of speech, how sentences and paragraphs are constructed, and the correct use of punctuation.
